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INCLUSIVE DOCUMENTARY TEXT AS A COMPONENT OF FORMING INCLUSIVE CULTURE OF FUTURE TEACHER

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Ukrainian society is increasingly talking about open space for all: whether in the field of life, or in culture, or in education. However, there are some difficulties: inclusive space, inclusive culture. One of the factors in the formation of an inclusive culture is the reading of relevant literature, including documentaries, from which the world of a person with disabilities emerges with its problems, pains, difficulties and strength.

Such book is Sophie Lutz's stories “The Philippine. The Power of a Fragile Life” and “Beyond the Visible”. The author is the mother of a child with multiple disabilities. She tells the story of her family and the daily struggle not only for life, but also for the smile of the Philippine. And if the first book is a story about the perception of the Philippine by family and the world [1; 2], the second is a story about learning about the Philippine and trying to open its mystery. The author says that the birth of the Philippine has helped to re-evaluate all values and give them new meaning. Thanks to the girl, she wondered if her life had more meaning than her daughter's life just because she could do something she couldn't do.

Shilo Harris, Nick Vujicic, Anton Dubishyn, and Ivan Baidak write about their own experience of living with a disability. Shilo Harris says about himself: “I am the man who survived hell. It is very difficult to put it into words. Slaughterhouse. Destruction. Loss” [3]. Since 2010 he became a speaker who tells about his experience of the war, as well as supporting veterans and wounded soldiers. The author is sincere with the reader and talks not only about the experience he can be proud of. He does not hide the truth, and we read about his difficult relationship with his children, his wife. He talks about his pain, torment, fears and the hell he saw.

Christian preacher Nick Vujicic says that the main thing is not to be disappointed, not to be afraid to ask for help and work hard on yourself and for yourself. One of his most popular books, “The Life Without Limits”, is about overcoming despair and becoming happy. He talks about the torture he had as a child. He says that he struggled with the desire to kill himself, about his pain from understanding that he will never be as other. In the end, he manages to turn his burden into something more important [4].

The autobiographical story of the poet, public figure, volunteer Anton Dubishyn “Special Revelation” acquaints us with the Ukrainian realities of life of people with disabilities. The author talks about his traumatic childhood experiences, related not only to his own disability, but also to domestic violence. The book tells the story of the first steps of socialization and how difficult they were, the importance of understanding your purpose in this world, helping others. A special place belongs to the author's reflections about the role of a person with a disability in society, on the possibilities of self-realization, as well as on the Soviet negative experience of anti-inclusion. The author says that the secret of his success is acceptance of himself as he is, faith in his own strength, and thus the acceptance and faith of society in him and his strength. He sees the way out of the existential crisis in self-acceptance [5].

Ivan Baidaky's book “The Invisible” is also about the self-acceptance. It deals with the stories of four people with Vitiligo, Tourette's syndrome, alopecia and hemangiomas. The heroes tell us about their conflict with the world, which does not perceive them because of these external factors, about difficult communication with people who often do not understand the person with physical disabilities, about the crisis of relations with the world and ways out. The heroes first took the first steps to understand themselves, then looked at the world, and then the stories of dramas and failures turn into stories on success [6].

These books play an important role in forming of the inclusive culture of future teachers due to their relevance and realism, so we offer them to students of pedagogical specialties to read during the special course “Literature and Inclusion”, as they help to form a conceptual framework, compare foreign and Ukrainian inclusive realities. understand the difficulties faced by a person with a disability.

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
